He returned to Portland full of enthusiasm for the beautiful yalley, its fine climate and wonderful oppor-

tunities. So, post haste, the two, now-partners, returned and purchased 19 acres. Later four small tracts were bought and 28 acres leased, making a total of 70 acres in orchard and nursery. Though all the adjoining farms have changed hands many times, being satisfied, they refused many good offers for their holdings. Their own plantings came into bear

ing and as the idea of mechanical siz-ing of apples became general, it was natural that these men, with years of Residence Tel. 3412 shop experience, should design and build a machine for their own use. Neighbors came to see, and a demand grew for a simple, dependable machine. At first the shop equipment was hand tools only. A steady increase in the business has made it necessary to install machine tools. At this time all the parts, both wood and iron, are manufactured in their own shop. Rough lumber, castings and belting are bought outside. Belting is bought in lots of 17,000 feet or more. Eastern

maple, gum, spruce, fir and white pine are used in car lots. Improvements are made from year to year but always with the idea that the machine be of the fewest number of parts possible and that it handle the fruit in such a manner that there be absolutely no bruising or skin pune

That the builders of the Ideal Grad ing Machine have advanced beyond all competitors is evidenced by these facts: That many machines have been shipped to Australia, Tasmania and New Zealand, for both apple and orange packers; that a crew of men is now working on a number of large machines for warehouse installations next spring. The factory is working on parts for a run of 100 machines for 1924 delivery. These will range in size from small 2-belt, 4-sorter type to the large 4-belt, 12 sorter type. One of the latter recently installed at Prosser, Wash., ran 1018 packed boxes in ap-ples that were 20% culls, in eight

The increased production demands the building of a new shop 60x100 feet. Shipments are going out and machines are being assembled at this other packing house equipment are manufactured here.
