Pursuant to the order of the Common Council, contained in Ordinance No. 658 of the City of Hood River, Oregon, passed by the Common Council April 21, 1924, and approved by the Mayor on the 24th day of April, 1924, notice is hereby given that the undersigned City Engineer will receive bids for the following improvement:
