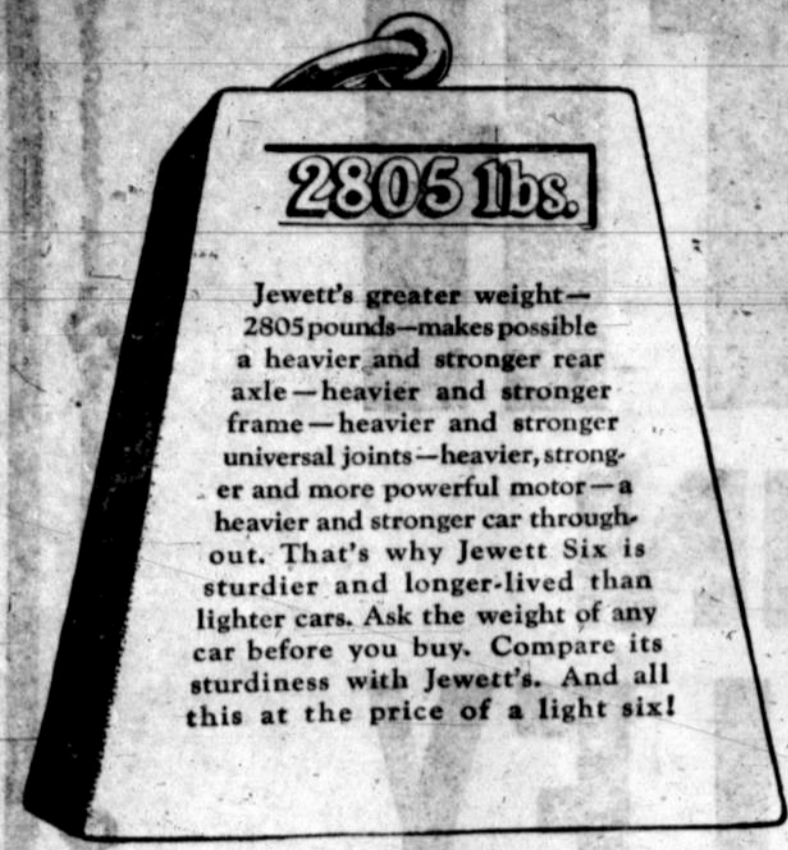

COUNTY HEALTH NOTES

Arrangements are being made for the four-day series of clinics to be held July 7, 8, 9 and 10 under the auspices of the Public Health Association. Mrs. Bickford, public health nurse, has made tentative plans to hold the clinic July 7 in Parkdale, Parkdale, Mount Hood and Middle Valley children; the 8th in Hood River for Pine Grove, Dee and Hood River districts; the 9th in Odell to reach the Odell and Central Vale territory, and the 10th at Hood River for Oak Grove, Barrett and Frankton. Dr. Estelle Ford Warner, of Portland, will be present for the clinics, and the local doctors will be asked to assist so that all the children may be examined professionally, and without too great delay.

Fifty-eight are enrolled in the classes for home hygiene and care of the sick conducted by Mrs. H. L. Bickford in Odell, Oak Grove and Pine Grove. The Odell class meets Tuesday and Thursday afternoon, Pine Grove Monday and Friday, and the Oak Grove class Wednesday. Later on the Oak Grove class will have two meetings each week.

Classes will be continued July 7, 8, 9 and 10, when clinics are to be held in various parts of the valley.

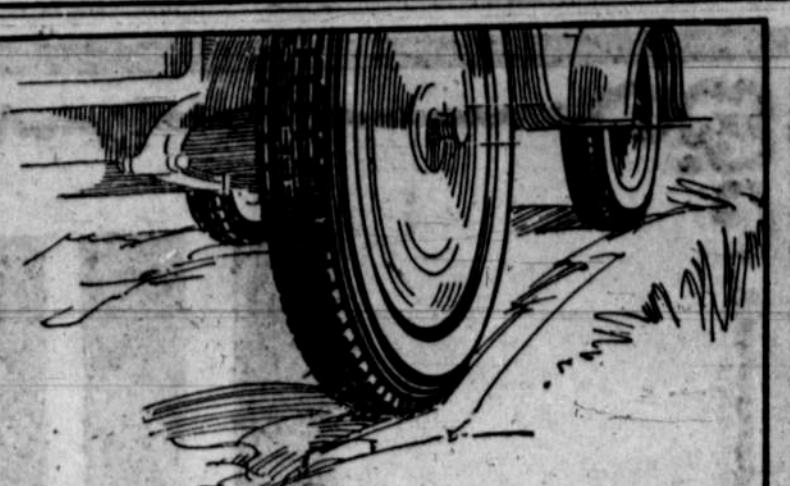
