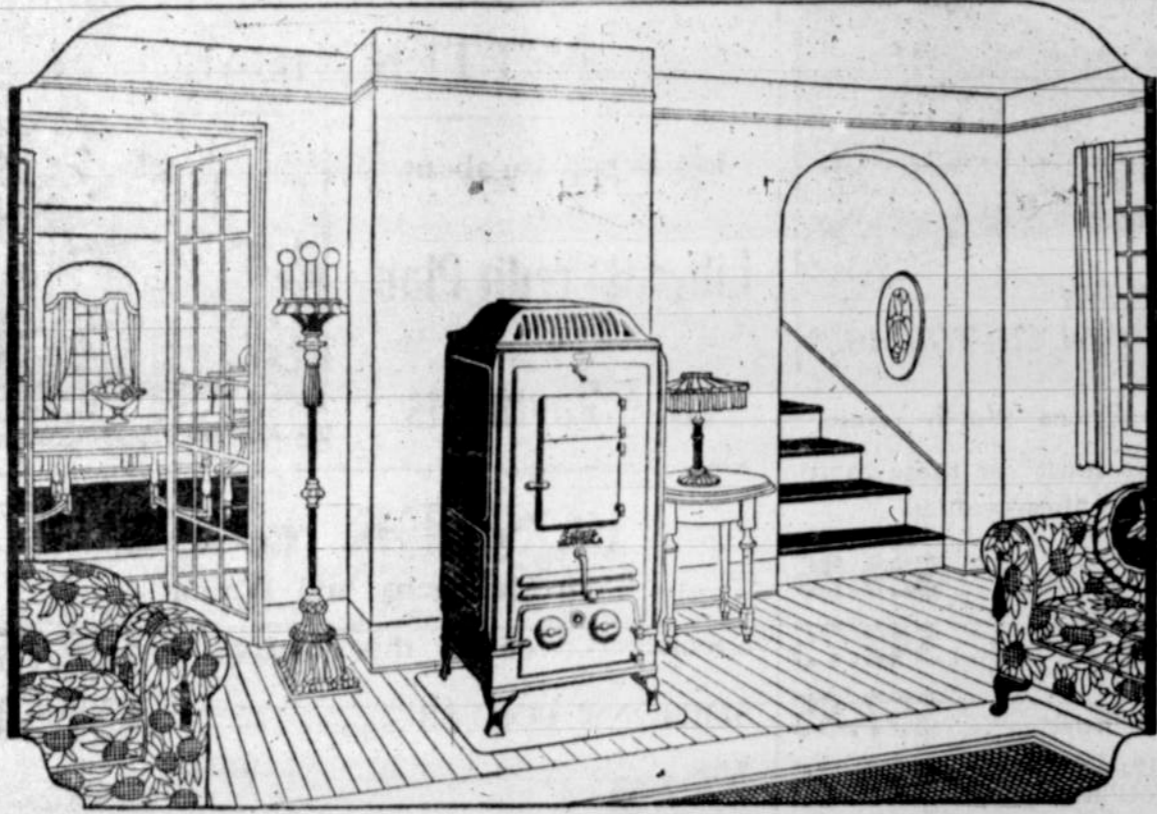

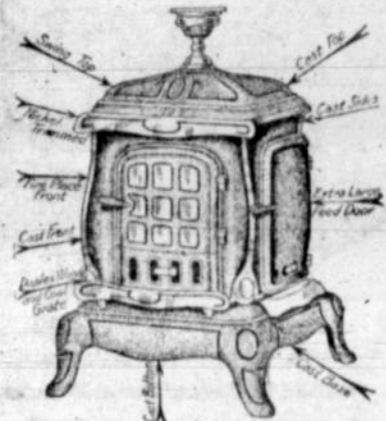

STAGE AND SCREEN

"One Night in Rome" is the third Laurette Taylor production in which the star appears in the film adaptation of her best stage play. Unlike "Peg O' My Heart" or "Happiness," however, "One Night in Rome" gives Miss Taylor a sober, more dramatic role—that of the excellent Lady Dinall, the faithful wife of an unfaithful Italian duke. Of the two Miss Taylor is far more capable of portraying the vixen, the capricious young Irish lass, but she looks more the grown, dignified Lady Dinall of "One Night in Rome." The theme is strictly continental in atmosphere and the plot also reflects upon the temperament of the people of the continent. Lady Dinall endures her husband's (the duke's) unfaithfulness because she reverences her father, the prince. The duke, a traitor to his country, is given the choice of killing himself. He does so, making it appear that his wife's unfaithfulness is the cause. The prince promises vengeance upon her. She hides away in London, posing as a fortune teller, but is discovered by a famous tenor who had once failed to win her favor. Later the prince finds Dinall, tells her he has learned the truth, and she is happy with her English lover.

Next Wednesday and Thursday the play at the Rialto will be "The Enemy Sex" with Betty Compson in the stellar role. It is a brilliant production of Owen Johnson's story, the most startling of all the flapper, jazz series.

The Cosmo minstrels, an all white aggregation, will be presented at the Rialto next Wednesday and Thursday. The minstrels carry a band and orchestra and feature Eugene de Belle, late star of the Al G. Field's minstrels. He is known as a foremost singing comedian. Hazel Joy appears with the show in songs and dances.

Sunday the Rialto will present "Daddies," from the popular play by John Hobble, featuring Mae Marsh, Claude Myers, Claude Gillingwater, Claire Adams, Crawford Kent, Cecilia Dean Moran, Willard Louis and a cast of screen favorites. Directed by William Seiter, it is a story of an air-tight Bachelor's Club which was wrecked by one of Cupid's darts.
