### MR. LANE ENTBUSES OVER NEW BRIDGE

A. E. Lane, pioneer rancher and small man, of Gilmer, Wash., came here Wednesday night of last week for medical treatment for infection in his right hand. Several days previously he ran a loose strand of a steel cable into his hand, blood poisoning setting in.

"The new Hood River-White Salmon bridge," said Mr. Lane, "is going to do more than one can imagine for the country of Klickitat county lying between the Columbia and Mount Adams. It has already stimulated a host of anxious land owners there. It will benefit Hood River, in that the bridge will bring the ranchers to this city to trade and sell their products. The bridge brought me here last night to have my hand taken care of. In the old ferry days I would have remained at home suffering another night."

### Oakland Makes Record

In 1923 Oakland won both the sweepstakes and class cup in the Yosemite economy run, held under the supervision of the A. A. A. and incidentally smashed all existing economy records with a rasoulie mileage of 38.92.

During the last of November a stock Oakland touring car made the run from Pittsburgh to Philadelphia, a distance of 297.3 miles, on 7 1/2 gallons of gasoline or an average of 38.95 miles to the gallon. Thus the previous record for high gasoline mileage was again broken by Oakland—this time by a margin of two miles per gallon.

The run was made by the Engler-McKeen Automobile Company, Oakland dealer of Pittsburgh, with Earl Ritts, assistant service manager, doing all the driving. He left the Pittsburgh dealer with 10 gallons of gasoline. When he drove up to the front doors of the Philadelphia branch of Oakland he still had two gallons and three pints of gasoline left in his tank.

To prove that the car was an ordinary stock model, without any special appliances, Mr. Ritts made the entire return to Pittsburgh in high gear. There was no attempt to prove anything but economy of operation on this run.

### Best Grasses Good

Seed of fine bent grass, resistant to sour, wet conditions, and highly prized for lawns, golf courses, football fields, and other places where turf is needed, are now available. It is being produced in commercial quantities at Coquille, Or., and imports for the current year are moderately heavy.

The restorable turf formed by these grasses are probably best for moderately heavy soils. They grow native in many parts of the coast and Willamette valley sections.

In some instances shopped up sods are scattered over the ground and worked in, the lawns being formed by vegetative development.

### Wesley Club Defeats Mosier

The Wesley club, composed of a group of boys who recently installed gymnasium equipment in the basement of the Wesley Methodist church, Thursday night defeated the Mosier basketball team by a score of 13 to 8. The game, characterized as the best played here this season, was played at the high school auditorium. Coach Garrigue, of the high school, refereed the game.
