KENNEDY AWARDED DAMAGES OF \$400

A jury in circuit court last week
awarded J. E. Kennedy, who had
sued the city for \$500, alleging the
conversion of a small house that had
been removed from property, the pur-
chase of which he had contracted for
at the west edge of town, damages to
the extent of \$400. The city last
summer transferred to Chas. Batch-
elder the property, which Mr. Ken-
nedy has contracted to buy. The deed
of transfer reserved the right to the
small building, comfort station of an
automobile park and the right to re-
move the same up to July 1, 1924.
Testimony showed that city employes,
who stated that they were acting on
the instructions of City Park Com-
missioner Huelat, moved the building
in October of last year.

The plaintiff was represented by
A. J. Derby, City Attorney Smith
raised some interesting points of law,
declaring that the plaintiff, without
right of possession to the property,
was unable to bring suit. He asked
for a non-suit. Judge Wilson, admit-
ting the merit of the contentions,
ruled against the motion for non-suit,
declaring that he could give windy to
the contention and dispose of the
merits later on in the progress of the
case.

The old building has been removed
to a new and larger city automobile
park, which is now being operated by
Mr. Huelat.

Apple Shipments Dispatched

The last cargo of consequence that
will be carried for the season by the
Burness line, operating boats from
Portland to English and continental
European ports, was dispatched last
Thursday aboard the steamship Pa-
cific Trader. It consisted of 16,739
boxes of Newtown apples, consigned
chiefly to London and Liverpool.

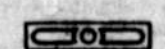
