**WHITE SALMON**  
 (By Will S. Bates)

Reports are current that the Will-  
 iams dam, which caused severe  
 damage when it went out, was dynamited.

 and suffering agony from a broken  
 collar bone and injured ribs. Bates  
 called for assistance, and the heavy  
 car was lifted, the lady released  
 and brought by Bates into Hood  
 River for treatment. The latter sus-  
 tained a deep cut on his leg when  
 the car fell back on him. The driver,  
 Thomas Hosty, was but slightly in-  
 jured, and his three young children  
 escaped unscathed. The strange part

 Hosty had stored his car in Bates'  
 garage at Portland Friday.

 present on the memorable occasion,
