**Corrosive Sublimates Effective:** Truck gardeners in Oregon who find their cabbage infested with maggots have an effective remedy in the corrosive sublimates, says Edna C. Mote, entomologist of the O. A. C. experiment station. A few days after the plants are set in the field they show a sticky bluish cast if infested. Four treatments are necessary. The insects are killed when the plants are covered in the waxes when the plants are pulled from the ground.

**Corrosive sublimates at the rate of one ounce to 20 gallons of water is effective on maggots on permanent plantings of cabbage. Two liquid ounces to the plant is ample, the material being simply poured on the surface of the soil about the plant. Four treatments are necessary. The first, three days after transplanting and the succeeding treatments at 10-day intervals.**

**Screen beds are necessary in growing susceptible plants from seeds. A square frame made of 12-inch boards covered with cheese cloth is satisfactory. A combination of the screened seed bed and the corrosive sublimates treatment in the soil insures a 100 per cent maggot free crop.**

**Boy Hurt in Auto Accident:** Donald, small son of V. G. Lettich, Portland, sustained serious cuts about the face Wednesday night last week when his father's automobile and one driven by Miss A. Shook, collided on the Columbia River Highway near Milwaukie Point tunnel. The boy, who had been treated at the hospital, was removed to Portland Thursday. Miss Shook suffered painful bruises.
