"The Spirit of Justice," was the theme of an oration of James Johnson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Thos. F. Johnson, who is a student of the law department at the University of Oregon.

Let us write these words in our hearts. They are a challenge to lawlessness; the battle cry of an awakening America. A committee of 1,000, the minute men of today, have taken the words and are leading the attack.
