STEVENSON
(From Skamania County Pioneer)
The Columbia forest has recently received its allotment of federal funds for the construction of roads, trails and improvements for the coming year. Approximately \$50,000 will be spent in the construction and maintenance of roads within the Columbia National forest and \$10,000 in the construction of fire trails and in opening up heretofore unprotected regions of the forest.

An additional \$3,000 has been allotted for construction of telephone lines and lookout houses in order to better protect the forest regions from fire. A crew has just completed the planting of one-half million Douglas fir trees on the South Fork of Lewis river in the western part of the Columbia National forest. If properly protected from fire, these trees will bring the land into full production of timber within 100 years.

One of the most interesting and instructive window displays ever seen in Stevenson was arranged the first of the week in the Stevenson Hardware by Forest Ranger Blodgett, of Hemlock station, in connection with American Forest Week - April 27 to May 3.

In the center of the window is a cross section of a huge Douglas fir that commenced its existence 440 years ago or in 1485. When this mighty tree was about the size of a good fish pole Columbus discovered America and when it had grown to the size of a telephone pole Sir Francis Drake made a trip to the Pacific coast.

Mr. Blodgett has placed arrows at the growth rings to mark the historical event occurring at that time. It shows the growth of the tree and the growth of the country and is a startling revelation in connection with the length of time it takes to grow a
