ROSE FESTIVAL PLANS SHAPING
Tuesday, June 16, will be Ocean night and Wednesday, June 17, will be Washington and "Wayfarer" night at the presentation of the 5,000-person city festival "Rosaria" during Rose Festival Week, the festival directors have announced.

Governor Pierce has been invited to be a guest of Portland and the festival directors Oregon night. President O. W. Nichols has sent a similar invitation for Washington night to Governor Roland H. Hartley and Mrs. Hartley of Washington. Officials of the "Wayfarer" production at Seattle also will be invited for Washington night.

Four weeks from next Monday will see the opening of "Rosaria" in the mammoth amphitheater being constructed on Multnomah field. The opening performance has been designated as Portland night in honor of the 5,000 singers, dancers and actors who are giving weeks of time to rehearsal and the 5,000 additional persons who will appear in the final scene of the pageant. Mail orders reaching Rose Festival headquarters at 605 Oregon building indicate that Portlanders soon will have bought all the opening night seats.

Spectators of this year's floral parade Thursday and of the Merrykhanas parade Friday, the new Rose Festival feature of comedy and entertainment, may sit as they watch them. The processions will be routed through Multnomah field and over the "Rosaria" stage before going through the city streets and the judges' stands will be on the field.

FRANZ BASEBALL WINDOW PRAISED
The baseball window dressed recently at the Franz Hardware store by Cecil Lafferty won a prize in the national contest staged by The Sporting Goods Dealer, a national publication.

Upper Valley Berry Festival Planned
The orchardists of the Upper Valley are planning a strawberry festival to be held at some date in early June. Mrs. W. J. Gibbs has been appointed chairman of a committee which will prepare for the event. Coinciding last year with the Rose Festival, the Upper Valley berry carnival failed to get an attendance expected from Portland.

A proposal to erect a union high school building was rejected about a month ago, when outlying districts opposed the project. A favorable vote, however, was cast in Cascade Locks.

A contract for the Cascade Locks school is expected to be let soon and the building will be completed in time for the opening of school next fall.

City Recorder Hows Last Week Exhibited the Season's Best Roses for Hood River. The blooms were from an old fashioned yellow tea rose, the name of which is not recalled, but that was not killed to the ground by the severe cold weather that prevailed last December at a time no protecting snow blanket had fallen.

Normally Hood River would have a profusion of rose blooms by this time. The effects of the December frosts, however, will result in a late blooming of roses this year.

DIAMOND NEWTOWNS BRING RECORD PRICE
Wired advices Thursday notified the Apple Growers Association that an average of \$4.38 per box had been received for a carload of fancy Newtowns sold in New York City at auction, the day before. The message stated that the price was a maximum for the season and, so far as had been ascertained, set the record price for all times for a carload of the Newtown variety.

The Association received news that a cargo of export extra fancy Newtowns forwarded by Simon, Shuttleworth & French to Hamburg had sold there for \$5.20 per box, a record for the season on export shipments.

Ball Advertising Is Effective
Names of 2,670 settlers interested in Oregon's agricultural opportunities were received last week by the land settlement department of the Portland Chamber of Commerce from H. W. Breyer, general immigration agent of the Northern Pacific Railway Company, as a result of the joint advertising campaign conducted by the three transcontinental lines cooperating in developing the Northwest.

This new list is in addition to 2,500 inquiries received by the department in March from the cooperatives, and an additional 1,000 received earlier in the year. A total of more than 10,000 inquiries have been received since the first of the year, according to W. G. Ide, manager.
