Mr. Crosby Writes from Maine

Brooks, Me., May 11, 1925.

Editor Glacier: Just a few lines to my old friends in dear old Hood River. I left Hood River Sunday, April 19, at 11:30 a. m. and arrived at Brooks the 24th at 2:30 p. m. Enjoyed the trip fine. Had a lot of changes in the weather. Out of Porterville we ran into a snow storm, and about eight inches of snow had fallen before we reached the summit. About two hours out of Chicago we had a heavy electrical storm with very heavy rainfall, which lasted several hours.

I never saw a place on my way from Oregon to Maine where the vegetation was so far advanced as in Hood River. There were some places where they had started to plough.

I got a surprise when I got here and found the snow all gone, not even a drift in the fence corner, and the frost all out and the ground settled and roads dusty—something that has not happened for a great many years, they say. It was a very dry year and there wasn't much moisture in the ground, so the frost didn't seem to have much effect. May 3 the mercury registered 53 degrees but it has been cooler since.

The farmers have commenced to put in their crops. It has been a hard year for the farmers here. Potatoes are worth 15 cents per bushel and hay from \$10 to \$12 per ton. Eggs are selling at 30 cents. So the people are pretty close run financially. They have to use lots of fertilizer.
