Hecke, director of the state department of agriculture. The embargo was declared following the discovery of the so-called cherry fruit fly on a shipment recently shipped to California.

The Oregon counties exempt from the quarantine ruling are Hood River, Wasco, Umatilla, Curry, Josephine and Jackson.
