Know All Men by These Presents, That W. William H. Hood Council No. 8 of Hood River, Oregon, do by these presents, convey to Mt. Hood Council No. 8, and its friends the sole use and all obtainable enjoyments to be derived by this day's sojourn here, all of the property situated in Hood River County, State of Oregon, known throughout the world as "Lava Bed Orchard." Reserving only to ourselves, our heirs and assigns, the right to remonstrate against too many tired companions occupying the Lava-Bed. We hesitate to make this reservation, but feel we must be careful of the springs.

U. P. ISSUES 1925 NORTHWEST NEWS

The glorious message of the Pacific Northwest is being again broadcast to the world by means of a 50,000 issue of that very interesting book, "The Pacific Northwest and Alaska," which has become a high-class standard publication in the stupendous library of rarities. Hereafter, it is not only conspicuous for its superior workmanship, being a real masterpiece of the engraver's and printer's art and fit to adorn any drawing room table, but it tells the story of Oregon and Washington in most pleasing and instructive text.

This is its fifth annual edition and represents a total circulation of 250,000, the potential value of which in equating its wide-spread readership with the splendor of scenery and homelike charm of this favored land can hardly be overestimated. The intriguing book carries a full-page picture of the Hood River valley. Several pages are devoted to a description of the Columbia River highway and the mid-Columbia country.

A Trip Through the Durant Plant (Article 2—Painting Department)
Scrubbing the bodies with gasoline, sanding and being blown with hoses, and coating the wooden parts, make you acquainted with the preliminaries before actual painting and baking.

Then, before enameling, bodies are "lacked ragged" to pick up any metal particles, the open edges are sealed with abolic and the paint flowed on in a heavy, rich stream of enamel which is washed down to give an even glass-like smoothness. Thus, into the long electrically controlled ovens the bodies go, to bake at 300 degrees Fahrenheit for two hours. At the end of the ovens, men take these "first oven bodies," sand and recast and send them being through the second oven for two hours at 300 degrees. In the meanwhile "second oven bodies" are being checked over and inspected, rubbed with pumice stone and water to secure a perfect surface, and given a last coat of wear-resisting finishing enamel, which results in an unsurpassed body of high bake, enduring black enamel.

With color jobs, the process is longer—six or seven days elapsing before completing surface preparation, priming, baking, two coats of "flowed on" ground color, baking, two coats of color varnish and "sweating." (Article three next week)

Mrs. Scoobe Is Candidate
Mrs. E. L. Scoobe, past instructor of the department of Oregon Women's Relief Corps, will be a candidate for president of the department at the approaching convention, to be held at Oregon City beginning June 22. Mrs. Scoobe is a past president of Canby Corps. G. A. R. has instructed its delegation to support C. B. Zoek, of Bandon, for department commander.

Delegations from both the post and corps will attend the Oregon City encampment and convention. It is expected that 10 veterans will be present from Hood River.

Cooper to Enforce Weed Law
A. B. Cooper, former member of the staff of County Fruit Inspector Kocken, has been appointed by the county court to enforce the law which provides that all property owners cut Canadian and Russian thistles and other noxious weeds. The court has designated the entire county, with the exception of the corporate limits of the city of Hood River a weed control district. Mr. Cooper will patrol the county and where property owners fail to comply with the law, the weeds will be cut by county crews, the cost being assessed against the property owners.

STAGE BONDSMEN IN TOILS OF LAW

Seal Freedman, president of the United Underwriters, Inc., and Isaac Freedman, his son, who is vice-president, were arrested Thursday afternoon on secret indictments by the Multnomah grand jury which charged them with altering a bank check and forgery of a waiver of further damage above the indorsement signature of Clifford A. Wells, who was injured in an automobile accident.

I. R. Joplin, manager of the underwriters' company, was arrested likewise on a new charge of forgery. He had been indicted on another phase of the same transaction some time ago and since has been out on bail.

Mr. Wells and his family were riding in an automobile on the Columbia River highway when their machine was struck by a Columbia stage. Wells and his wife and son were injured. At the hospital, it is alleged, Joplin appeared for the insurance company handling the stage's business, to take Wells' statement, and offered him temporary financial relief in the form of a \$25 check. It is alleged that Wells was induced to indorse the check half way down the paper, whereupon Joplin tendered him \$25 and took back the check for record. It is charged that when the check reappeared it was for \$1025 and above Wells' indorsement, on the space left blank, had been written in complete receipt and waiver of further damage.

Insufficient evidence had been gathered at the time of Joplin's first indictment to connect the Freedmans with the affair, it was said, and the indictments cover subsequent investigation.

GENERAL FRUIT OUT-LOOK UNDER NORMAL

The outlook for fruit crops was rather unfavorable, department of agriculture crop officials declared last week. The condition of apples June 1 was nearly 20 per cent below the usual average on that date, they said. "Frost in late May," a statement said, "reduced prospects in many scattered localities. Northwestern states expect more apples to be picked last year, but for the country as a whole the crop does not seem likely to be as large."

"Fruit production shows a large increase in California, where most of the crop is canned or dried, but in practically all other important states the crop is expected to be substantially smaller than last year."

"The pear crop also is only fair, California being the only important producing state which expects a materially larger crop than was harvested last year."

Association Plans Growers Meeting
Pursuant to a resolution adopted by the directorate of the Apple Growers Association, the board will hold growers' meetings the third Wednesday afternoon of each month. All members of the cooperative organization are invited to attend these meetings and interpose suggestions.
