

PACIFIC POWER & LIGHT COMPANY SHOWS 150% Increase in Sales of Light and Power


H. E. Baker, district manager of the Pacific Power & Light Company, in commenting on the sales of disc-trical energy by his company, states that a sleady increase, in kilowatt hour sales has been applied over the system. The chart which he has prepared shows sales of approximately 28,000,000 kilowatt hours in the year 1913 and sales of approximately 70,000,000 kilowatt hours in the year 1924, or an increase of 150%.



This increase is due to the increasing popularity of electricity for power purposes, the develop territory served, the increased use of labor-saving devices in the home, and a general demand for better lighting

Electricity, said Mr. Baker, has become so much a part of community life as to be practically indispensable One dislikes to contemplate the chaos that would result from discontinuance of electrical service for a long period of time. Here in the Hopd River valley where over 700 farms depend on electrical energy for their successful operation and of these more than 100 depend altogether on electricity for cooking, such a sudden cutting off of service would prove a calamity indeed and could be well compared with the inconvenience caused by the sudden disappearance of all the automobiles and trucks in use if such could be imagined.
