Dead Point Fish Hatchery Appealing. One of the most attractive places on the upper reaches of Hood river is the Dead Point trout hatchery, located where Dead Point creek tumbles more than 75 feet from the West Fork just below the Devil's Punch Bowl. The pools of the hatchery, where 1,800,000 eastern brook rainbow and steelhead trout are growing rapidly, are fed by crystal clear water of the Dead Point. Giant ferns and plants fringe their shadows across the fishery grounds.
