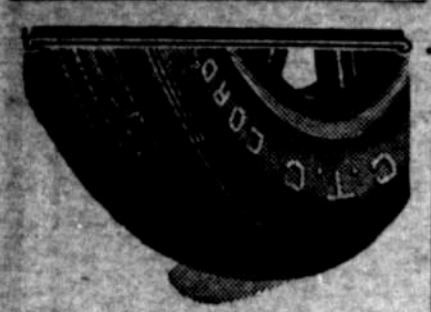


WHITE SALMON

APPLE CROP PLACED AT 70 PER CENT

The Hood River district of Oregon, in which is generally included the nearby sections, and the districts across the river in Washington, about the middle of July promises to have about 60 per cent of the 1924 tonnage.

Quality of fruit promises good this season. Thorough spraying for blight mite in the dormant spray has almost eliminated the damage from this source.

While few growers applied the oil spray for leaf roller this year, on account of substituting the dormant lime sulphur spray for blight mite, there is little leaf roller injury.

which has smaller sizes than the Lower Valley, a number of large orchards have been taken as blocks for export shipment.

Late pears in the entire district, we believe, will not vary much from last year. On the Washington side of the river the crop is very light.

Summarizing, we would say apples for the district promise about 60 per cent of last year, size and quality will be better than ordinary, and export sizes will be light.
