GREAT POETS

Oliver Goldsmith, 1728-1774 Oliver Goldsmith was born at Palis, county of Longford, Ireland, November 10, 1728. His poems make but a small fragment of his works, yet they are finely wrought, and of a quality not to be surpassed. His poetry belonged to his highest self, to his affections, and to his imagination. Goldsmith's verse won for him fame and friendship, nevertheless he felt that his was not a poetic age. The keenest intellect of his time found their proper utterance in prose. Goldsmith discerned his own gift. He was in no hurry to be a poet and looked carefully to make sure of himself and of his way. Never did he copy the reputation of a literary bully; he was no loud contentious noise; if he hated anything, he hated the rage of party spirit.

WASHINGTON CROP STATISTICS GIVEN

(By L. H. Codrwall, manager of American Fruit Growers) The writer spent all of last week in the Yakima and Wenatchee districts, determined to produce a better and more uniform crop of apples. Before they go on duty for actual protective work, the spring training camp is given practical tests on the ground. Now equipment is explained and tried out. Then the boys are taught, organization plans coordinated, and ideas exchanged. "We feel that these camps are a valuable part of our forest fire work," said A. O. Wadsworth, district forester in charge of the protection. "We want every man to know his job, how he is to do it, just where he fits into the organization, and be ready to meet any emergency. We can't always prevent the public from starting forest fires, so we always try to handle the fires as quickly and efficiently as possible when they do get started."
