The corporation that recently took over the stock let a contract Wednesday for the erection of the span, to the Union Bridge Co., of Portland. The amount of the contract is not known.

The structure will be 20 feet wide except in the center, where plans call for a width of 40 feet, and appropriate places for people to view the rapids below and the scenic hills on both sides of the Columbia river. The span will be 100 feet high in the center, of steel truss type and of steel construction. Work will be way within six weeks and the bridge will be open for traffic in July of next year.

CASCADE AVENUE PAVING
