It is the old story, a mountain was  
 made out of a mole hill. Those of us  
 who know District Attorney Baker  
 know that he is a combative man,  
 eager to protect the interest of his  
 people, therefore the kind of fellow  
 who won't let anybody step on him or  
 his county.

The motor association officers are of  
 similar caliber. When Manager Bran-  
 denburg's letter reached Judge Blagg  
 and District Attorney Baker they read  
 between the lines that Brandenburg  
 was threatening them. In their reply  
 Brandenburg read between the lines  
 that they were telling him to go to  
 blue blazes, and when flint meets flint  
 sparks must always fly.

So I made a trip to Hood River,  
 personally, and there talked with the  
 traffic officers of the city and county  
 of Hood River and the up-shot of the  
 meeting was that there was no inten-  
 tion of being other than fair with  
 every motorist and tourist coming into

 a tourist obeying laws. The motor  
 association has no quarrel with such  
 an attitude and since we are both  
 striving for the same purpose there  
 was no need for any disagreement.

The matters naturally adjusted  
 themselves and I was pleased to be  
 able to go, immediately following this  
 meeting, to the Tuesday business  
 men's club and tell them that matters  
 were now completely adjusted to the  
 satisfaction of all concerned.

I believe the motorist will find  
 courtesy at the hands of Hood River  
 county and all the officials bid you  
 welcome to Hood River county but  
 notify you now that, if you try to  
 get on the other side of the road or  
 road or dodge in and out, or drive be-  
 yond the speed limits you will pay the  
 penalty. Every good motorist must  
 agree that Hood River county officials  
 are entirely right in this stand.

### VANCOUVER CELE- BRATING BIRTHDAY

Vancouver, Wash., the oldest North-  
 western city, is host this week to folk  
 from all sections of the country. The  
 Clark county capital is celebrating  
 the 100th anniversary of founding of  
 old Fort Vancouver. A feature of  
 the celebration is the staging each  
 day of the pageant, "The Coming of  
 the White Man."

The celebration will continue until  
 Saturday night, and consists in addi-  
 tion to a monster pageant with a  
 company of 310 persons, each evening,  
 of a large industrial exposition, the  
 first automobile show ever held in  
 southwestern Washington and a big  
 "joy zone," which will add color and  
 zest to the celebration.

Vancouver is in gala attire for the  
 event and preparations have been  
 made to handle the big crowd of vis-  
 itors which it is expected will be on  
 hand.

For the pageant, directed by Dwight  
 Parrish, the Centennial has obtained  
 the use of all the electric parapher-  
 nalia used in the production of "The  
 Wayfarer" at Seattle and for the stag-  
 ing and scenery the elaborate equip-  
 ment has been obtained from the Por-  
 tland rose festival and used in produc-  
 tion of "The Star" by John W. Todd in  
 directing the vocal music for the  
 pageant and Henry N. Stoudermayer  
 the instrumental music. Seating ca-  
 pacity of 5500 has been arranged for  
 the pageant.

### EGG GRADING LAW WILL BE ENFORCED

That the egg grading law will be  
 enforced in Hood River county is a  
 certainty, according to a statement  
 made by C. D. Nickelson, president  
 of the Oregon State Poultry associa-  
 tion. In discussing the matter Mr.  
 Nickelson said:

"The present egg grading law is a  
 good one and is workable. It insures  
 the purchaser honest weight and  
 value for his money. The public has  
 been buying eggs for many years  
 sight-and-unsure. No attention has  
 been given the matter of weight.  
 Dealers have been selling 18-ounce  
 eggs for the same price as 24-ounce  
 eggs, and the purchaser has been un-  
 able to pierce the mystery of the  
 egg shell to determine the quality of  
 the egg, and often time the quality  
 has been fully up to strength.

"Every commercial poultryman in  
 Hood River county who ships through  
 the Pacific Cooperative Poultry Pro-  
 ducers, the poultryman's cooperative  
 selling agency at Portland, pays two  
 cents per dozen to have his eggs can-  
 dled for weight and quality before  
 they reach the consumer. The pur-  
 chaser of eggs placed on the market  
 by this cooperative concern receive  
 full value for their money. The buy-  
 ing public is entitled to a good fresh  
 egg of standard weight instead of a  
 jumble lot in weight and quality.  
 The merchants should pass the mat-  
 ter of weights and grades on to the  
 seller who offers the eggs to the  
 store. However, if the merchants de-  
 sire to assume this responsibility and  
 added labor they are at liberty to do  
 so. The state association and all  
 commercial poultrymen are back of  
 the new egg law.

"It is evident that all eggs must be  
 candled in order to determine if they  
 are fresh or not, and to mark eggs  
 'Fresh Under-sized,' unless candled  
 would be a hazardous business. A  
 number of arrests are being made in  
 different sections of the state and the  
 law is being universally upheld by  
 the courts and fines are imposed for  
 violations."
