**UPPER VALLEY STARTS BETTER IRRIGATION**

The Upper Valley orchardists are following the wake of the Lower Valley orchardists in the installation of modern irrigation. J. D. Smullin, who is the owner of a splendid orchard in the foothills east of Parkdale, has just completed the installation of a concrete distribution system with a concrete water main conducting his domestic and irrigation water to his home and orchard. The work has been done under the direction of E. E. Newell, Irrigation engineer. Mr. Smullin proposes to follow this with the installation of a concrete distributing system with valves such as are now in use in many farms of the Lower Valley orchards.

Mr. Smullin is fortunate in the possession of an independent water supply which is not even contested by the power company. The water is supplied by a small stream coming from the foothills east of him and at a sufficient elevation so that he can utilize the water for power prior to its use for irrigation and domestic purposes. With the power of the Foster wheel he runs his apple grader and generates electricity for home, apple house and barns. The power combine has no terrors for him.
