Bert J. McCloud, Globe, Ariz., cowboy, who Saturday, September 19, left the Round-Up at Pendleton on a 20,000 mile ride through every state of the Union, reached here last Saturday astride his horse, Red Eagle. McCloud, who stated that he was 15 miles ahead of schedule, reached Portland Tuesday. He will arrive at the state fair today.
