Cooperative weather report for 24-

day: Maximum temperature 56; mini-  
mum 46; precipitation .24 of an inch;  
cloudy; light westerly wind.

When J. L. Morris (Dad) burned a  
big slash on Thursday night he fur-  
nished the forest fire thrill of the  
season in the Burdoin mountain district.  
It was erroneously reported that the  
Bristol school house was menaced and  
a call was broadcast for volunteer fire  
fighters. Some of the men responded  
and did some good work. Fire Warden  
Geo. C. Collins, of Underwood, was a  
very busy man during the early part  
of the evening fighting a bad fire in his  
own neighborhood and could not re-  
spond to the Bristol call until 10:30  
p. m. By this time the fire was prac-  
tically under control. The fire was  
spectacular while it lasted. Luckily  
there was no wind and very little dam-  
age resulted.

The apple harvest is well under way  
and help is more plentiful than ever  
known. Many people have motored  
from Yakima and Wenatchee hoping to  
secure employment and have been dis-  
appointed. One outfit that had come  
from those districts reported that there  
were fully 5000 people camped there  
who were unable to obtain employment  
in orchards.

Bates Bros.

of Mrs. Argous Thomas, of White  
Salmon; Mr. and Mrs. E. E. Elkins, of Port-  
land, are vacationing in Burdoin  
Heights orchards, picking fruit.

An elderly Japanese on the mountain  
who claims to be no mean weather  
prophet, states that the coming winter  
will be a real one, or to put it in his

The Legion apple harvest dance is  
scheduled for October 2, 3 and 4 on over.

ral inspector, has been elected com-  
mander of Evan Childs Post No. 87,  
American Legion. S. S. Williams is  
the new vice commander and John  
Childs, third member of executive  
board. The election was held Wednes-  
day night.

ceptably slow this season. It is  
probably due to leaving Newtons on  
the trees to attain larger size. They  
are not fully matured on Burdoin.

**Car Wrecked at Tunnel**  
Sheriff Edick was called out of bed  
at 3 a. m. Sunday to investigate the  
wreck of an automobile near Mitchell  
Point tunnel. He found a roadster,  
bearing a Washington license, turned  
entirely over at a curve. The lights  
were still going.

While he did not learn who the oc-  
cupant of the car was, the sheriff re-  
ceived a telephone call from Cascade  
Locks stating that the two men had  
been brought there. One had a crushed  
shoulder and the other suffered  
mangled hands.

Indications were that the car had  
been traveling at a high rate of speed,  
according to Sheriff Edick.

**Truck Men Warned**  
Jay Salzman, state traffic officer, of  
The Dalles, was here last Friday co-  
operating with local authorities in  
checking motor trucks engaged in ap-  
ple hauling. Officers say they found  
a pronounced tendency to overload  
trucks hauling apples to shipping  
point. Warnings, however, have been  
issued, and growers and transporta-  
tion concerns will be prosecuted, it  
was declared.

Mr. Salzman also stated that the  
new ruling of the state highway com-  
mission in decreasing the load of  
trucks operating over the Columbia  
River highway from the Multnomah  
county line to The Dalles will be rigid-  
ly enforced.
