JAPANESE PLANNING COMMUNITY HOUSE

Japanese orchardists and M. Yasui, orchardist-merchant of this city, have completed the plans for construction of a community house to be used exclusively by Japanese families. The recreational center, which will rise soon on West Sherman avenue, will cost approximately \$10,000. The structure will cover 70 by 30 feet. A central hall will be 30 by 10 feet. The full basement will be equipped to serve dinners and accommodate meetings. A kitchen will be provided. Grounds of about two acres will be arranged according to landscape effects familiar in the Japanese homeland.

Commenting on the plans for the new building, Mr. Yasui said: "Many of the Japanese orchard owners have been greatly worried over the status of their children, who, American-born, are destined to spend their lives here. Few, if any, realize the situation of these children. They are being educated in the public schools and are fast assimilating American ideals and language. The children, while young, learn the Japanese language from hearing their parents talk, but just as soon as they go to school they begin to adopt the American language for their own use. There are some Japanese born in the United States, now grown men and women, who do not understand Japanese. "The vast majority of these children are destined to live their lives in the United States, many of them in Hood River county. The constitution of the United States says they are Americans, and now Japan says they are Americans, and so their parents have decided to accept the inevitable and do all they can to have them brought up as Americans by teaching and by contact with other Americans.

"In order to bring about a better understanding between whites and Japanese, the community hall is being projected. It will be for purely Japanese meetings. But the white people will be invited, and if they desire they may have the hall for their own meetings and amusements.

"During the summer months a summer school may be conducted in the new hall for the purpose of teaching the Japanese children American ideals. The big idea back of the movement is to teach our children that they are Americans and to eliminate the ideas of a dual nationality. The Japanese parents, who feel sure that they will receive the support of many white folk of the valley, want to be able to demonstrate that children of the district, born of Japanese parents, may grow up to be Americans in the truest sense of the word."

W. T. Price drew the plans for the Japanese community house. It will be built by Edward Krieg.

Board Used as Weapon

George H. Jones, restaurant proprietor, was in jail at Stevenson, Wash., last week and George Hayward, county commissioner, was on his way to a Portland hospital as the result of an altercation over an alleged debt. Jones, charged with first degree assault, is accused of having hit Hayward with a board, breaking his nose and injuring an eye so that its sight might be lost.

Jones said that Hayward owed him \$50 which he refused to pay.
