WHITE SALMON
Cooperative weather observer's report for 24-hour period ending at 5 p. m. Saturday: Maximum temperature 56, minimum 35, clear, east wind.

Mr. Shannon, a partner of Mr. Klunk, of eastern Oregon, has sold his interests in the M. L. Kline ranch, Burdoin Heights, to Mr. Klunk, who will operate the place. He has leased the property for a term of years, and has established a small dairy farm.

The Hunsaker slashing on the J. H. Law ranch is still burning, having eaten its way eastward into the heavy timber. This fire has been burning a week and several huge trees have fallen over into dense windfalls and dead brush, menacing the heavy timber and cut wood owned by other parties.

Frank I. Bevier, of Portland, owner of the old Ramey ranch, is reported as being ill in Portland. He is expected here Tuesday to make arrangements for his apple crop, which is being packed by Bates Bros. His mother and two brothers, Bert and Dewey Bevier, will spend the winter in Oregon.

Worms have taken a heavy toll this year on the apple crop. The tonnage will be very light on extra fancy grade in the higher levels. Inspection is very rigid and orchardists are somewhat discouraged over the outlook at this time, but will try, try again, and those who can afford it will put on additional spray next year. Some have applied from seven to nine applications without very good results. Heretofore wormy apples have been almost unknown in the Burdoin mountain district. Ralph Burdick states that if these pests cannot be eliminated he will grub out his trees and plant grapevines, honey and succotash and make a real living on his place.

Bill Brown, mayor of North White Salmon, had a very narrow escape from serious injury Thursday morning while en route to Bingen with 60 logs of cull apples in a Ford truck which had never been equipped with brakes. When he passed Judge Harris' residence he was a mere streak and going so swiftly that the outfit was invisible to the naked eye. Bill stayed with the ship, narrowly missing the local freight, which switches all day long in the Bingen yards, and a heavy lumber truck. He finally landed right side up at Baker & Co's warehouse, where he broadcasted a message for brake linings, outside brake bands and a new engine. He was unhurt, but greatly perturbed. The Bingen speed cop's eyesight failed to register on this occasion.

Burdoin Heights has a real earnestist in the person of Dewey Bevier, who was in the service of the United States navy during the world war. Residents of the above district have of late been treated to nightly concerts played at the young man's home high up on the hill. It is suspected that these are for the benefit of two comely young ladies who reside on Bates' perpendicular farm. "I Love You Truly" and "Taps" come in perfectly fine. Mr. Bevier was a member of the big band organization which broadcast the first radio program from Catalina Island, California, several years ago.

Radio fans on Burdoin mountain are again enjoying programs from eastern stations after a rather lengthy vacation on account of dry weather and static. Some new radio converts in this district are planning installation of standard sets. New ideas on the part of radio engineers will soon consign many old sets to the junk pile. Prices will be much lower, it is thought.

The old bridge which has served so many Hood Riverites who have visited the Buck creek and Northwestern lake camping ground has again been demolished for trade, according to E. T. Breedlove, a resident of that district. He reports that the structure is in bad shape.

J. W. Breedlove, who has been enjoying an extended visit with his father in South Carolina, returned to White Salmon Friday.

A big harvest dance was given at Legion hall Saturday night. A large attendance was reported.

O. C. Groshong has purchased the C. C. Russell residence. Mr. Russell was also disposed of his service station at Bingen and will move to Kelo, Wash., to try his luck in a new venture.

Mrs. Wm. Claterbos is keeping books at Baker & Co's warehouse at Bingen.

The Mountain Brook people got a thrill out of a brush fire recently which threatened the Alfred Lumber company's mill. Volunteers from the Acme Orchard Co. assisted in checking the fire before any serious damage occurred.

While driving her Ford car home on the North Highway Saturday night, Mrs. Gaskill, of Bingen, was struck by Bob Charters, Bingen garage man, and her car badly damaged. No casualties resulted. Mrs. Gaskill is in the restaurant business at Bingen. Her new fireproof building is nearing completion. Mr. Charters' fireproof garage opened for business Monday.

Apple Picker Commits Suicide
Sidney Shaw, of Long Creek, here with his wife engaged as an apple picker, committed suicide at the Odell orchard home of W. L. Shelton Wednesday night of last week. He was 28. Conscious when found, Mr. Shaw admitted to Mr. Shelton that he had taken poison, apparently strychnine. Threats of self destruction by Mr. Shaw had been made repeatedly recently. Officials, however, were unable to ascertain the cause of his despondency. No children survive. Coroner Anderson shipped the body to Long Creek Friday.

D. H. McCLAIN HAS FINE SWEET POTATOES

D. H. McClain, former Michigan man who used to grow the tubers in his former state, has harvested 1100 pounds of sweet potatoes from less than an eighth of an acre. The potatoes are unusually large, many of them weighing 2 1/2 pounds. He planted 800 hills of the potatoes. Variegated cutworms cut off 200 of them.

"I believe that sweet potatoes can be grown profitably in Oregon if they are handled properly," said Mr. McClain. "They should not be over-irrigated. The ground should never be soaked, but just kept slightly moist."

Mr. McClain exhibited one of his potatoes at the Glacier office. It weighed more than three pounds. Ernest Samuel was associated with Mr. McClain in the production of the fine tubers.
