STAGE AND SCREEN

There is an element of romance in the fact that South Dakota was chosen as the location for "The Deadwood Coach," a Tom Mix production portraying life in the wildest west during the 50s. It was through the South Dakota Deadwood that the original Deadwood coach, on its perilous course over rocky roads and tortuous trails, attacked by hostile Indians and pursued by bandits eager to possess the freight of gold it often carried.

The Deadwood Trail started at Cheyenne and ran through Laramie to Deadwood, South Dakota. The first coach, built in 1863, was constructed of iron to be bullet proof. It was manned by eight guards besides the driver. Each guard carried a rifle and two revolvers, and their combined fire could deliver 136 shots without reloading. A replica of it is used in the film which will be shown at the Rialto Friday and Saturday.

It is said that Buffalo Bill Cody once had a horse which carried him over a hundred miles in nine hours and forty minutes, when he was being chased by Indians. Tom Mix's horse, Tugboat, never been tried out on an endurance report, but during the filming of "The Deadwood Coach," in South Dakota, he did a mile dash, over rough road in one minute, 48 seconds which led to a cow pony standing only 14 hands high.
