

The fruit, according to plans, must be delivered to the Association before December 1. Shippers must mark boxes, and the association will not be responsible for delivery.

Esquimaux peas, that delicious combination of ice cream and chocolate coating, have been made in large quantities by the Hood River Creamery this summer and fall. The fact that the peas have been wrapped in paper similar to the wraps of other creameries has led to the impression that they were not made by the local creamery. This idea is erroneous.

The creamery company purchases a standard wrapper, used by all creameries making Esquimaux peas. A royalty is paid with the purchase of the wrapper.


