JANE YODER WINS IRONSIDE AWARD

Truman Butler, chairman of the "Old Ironsides" committee of the local Elks lodge, announced Tuesday that Miss Jane Yoder, in the junior high grades of the Pine Grove school, was awarded the bronze medal for the best essay written by a student in the school.

Her bravery caused the Union to wake to think more of winning her freedom. Can you read over the history of Old Ironsides, and not feel more patriotic and work to save the ship that freed us, and woke up the colonies of that time to realize that freedom was in view?

In 1830 the United States Congress condemned that ship as an unworthy and ordered it destroyed. Great men of the day argued against it being destroyed, and at that time Oliver Wendell Holmes wrote his wonderful poem, "Old Ironsides."

People began to think to realize that Old Ironsides was something worth while, something to think about, and a great wave of patriotism swept over the Union. The people made congress change their minds and the ship was saved.

Many years later, when it seemed as if people had forgotten that there ever lived a ship like the Constitution, some one proposed using it for a target ship.

The congress of today argues to save and rebuild Old Ironsides, instead of destroying her. They understand her worth.
