RADIO NEWS

Learn to play bridge by radio, or if you already play learn to play better. This is the latest broadcast feature.

Arrangements have just been completed for KGO to broadcast bridge games every Tuesday night for 24 weeks, beginning November 3, between 9:30 and 10 o'clock. Each bid and play will be explained in detail so that listeners can play the game while listening to the experts. Each game will be prepared by Milton C. Work and Wilbur C. Whitehead, internationally known bridge authorities of New York City. Eighteen other American stations are broadcasting simultaneously with KGO, so that the entire nation is learning to play bridge at one time.

Games played will illustrate the original bid, the secondary bid, the take out, the informatory double, the denial, the assist, the business double, the four-card suit bid, how to gain the best bid for the combined hands of partners, the correct opening lead, partner's response, the come-on signal, the down and out signal, the proper discard, when to take the finesse, and when not to, the obligatory finesse, the obligatory duck, the squeeze play, the strip play, how to plan the play, deduction, the doctrine of chances, exit cards, throwing the lead, and practically all the other conventions and principles of the game.

Sherman Avenue within the City of Hood River, Oregon, from the West line of Second Street to the West line of Front Street by grading and graveling the sidewalk area for a width of five (5) feet along the south side of Sherman Avenue.

All work incidental to the construction and making of said improvement shall be done and the composition, dimensions and location and manner of constructing and making each part of said improvement shall be strictly in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor prepared by the City Engineer.

(From Skamania County Pioneer)

One of the biggest timber land deals made in this county in many years was recently closed when the Hiram Sibley timber interests were sold to the Westspar Lumber company of Portland. The deal includes many acres of timber land that have been held by the Sibley interest for many years. Originally the Sibley interest controlled one of the largest blocks of timber land in the state but the big fire that swept through this county several years ago reduced the holdings of live timber by many millions of feet the same as it did the timber in the Columbia national forests and other large private concerns.

The timber included in this deal is estimated to run between five and six hundred million feet—one of the largest blocks in the county and those who have seen it say it is an excellent stand of splendid stuff. The Westspar company has the timber at their mill in Columbia City, Ore., rafting the logs down the Columbia river to the mills. The company now is making extensive improvements and alterations to the Hamilton creek railroad over which the logs will be taken out. As soon as this work is done operation will be under way and about 100 men employed. The company plans to haul sufficient timber to last at least 20 years.

A contract for a steel suspension bridge across Wind river to replace the present wooden structure was let by the board of county commissioners Tuesday for \$14,900 to the Portland Bridge company. Work will start at once and the contract calls for the completion by February 15, 1926. The old wooden bridge which was built 10 years ago is in bad shape and not safe for heavy loads, having a broken needle beam and several of its members crushed. Most of the damage was caused by the heavy loads hauled over it this summer when the Wind River Lumber company's locomotives and logging equipment were run out of the valley. The new bridge will be of steel structure with a carrying limit of loads up to 15 tons. The towers which are practically new having been rebuilt recently will be retaining also the steel cables which have not been damaged. It will be a one-way bridge as at present but will be substantial and will carry the traffic for many years without much expense for upkeep.

The site of the bridge where it crosses the Wind river canyon about four miles up the valley from Carson is one of the scenic wonders for which Skamania county is famous and is worth going miles to see. It is like the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone on a smaller scale. The span at this point makes it possible to travel up this beautiful valley without encountering any steep grades. During the summer season there is much travel over it to the Government Mineral Springs, to Hemlock and other forestry service stations, to the huckleberry patches, to the logging camps and sawmills and to many fishing streams and camping spots. It also connects with the road being constructed to Guler, Trout Lake and Mount Adams. In fact it is one of the most useful bridges in Skamania county. The span is 554 feet long and 256 feet above Wind river.

Many Boats Use Locks

Seventeen boats have gone through the locks at Cascade Locks this month, totaling more than 600,000 feet of lumber, according to the reports in the office of V. W. Tompkins, engineer in charge.

The boats used for this work are twin-screw gasoline boats, and tow from 25,000 to 60,000 feet at one time. The logs from the Wind River mill have all been taken down to the lower mill since the mill stopped operation about two months ago.

There are still many logs to be taken down this fall before freezing weather begins and the work is being pushed as rapidly as possible.
