Miss Jeanice Turner, talented dramatic soprano, will be presented in concert December 1 for the benefit of the Hood River hospital. The concert is being given at the high school under the auspices of the Boy Scouts, who will turn all profits over to the Hood River hospital for the purchase of the new sterilizer recently installed.

Miss Turner made her debut in Italy where she sang with great success, winning notable mention from music critics there. "Lo Stuffle" (San Remo, Italy) comments: "In 'Amico Frits' a young American soprano, Miss Jeanice Turner, captivated San Remo. It is not often an American singer so young sings with such feeling and finesse."
