through purchases from the commissive of the Rhodes had the highest praise for the Columbia River highway, which he characterized as the most wonderful highway in the world. He complimented the progress of Oregonians in construction of the Columbia Gorge hotel.

"You folk are shead of your development program here in this hotel. But the construction of Cloud Cap imwill aid you in your hotel here. It will bring you more guests."

Mr. Rhodes told of the early campaigns to establish Paradise inn on Mount Rainier. Despite the rivalry between Tacoma and Scattle over naming the mountain, he said that business men from the two cities had gathered around a table with the sole aim of putting across a campaign for the now noted mountain hostelry. The first campaign, he said, had netted only \$25,000, and then another drive was made, which brought in another \$25,000, and on a third try, prominent men underwrote the amount of funds needed.

Leslie Butler, who has taken a prominent part in the campaign, delivered a short talk, following Mr. Rhode's address. He said that Dorsey B.
