MAYOR SETS ASIDE DAY FOR PICTURE

Mayor A. B. Bennett as chief executive of the city last week issued the first proclamation that concerns setting aside June 24 as "On Flanders Field Day," in commemoration of Hood River's part of the American Legion which is showing the war film "On Flanders Field" at the Elks Theatre today.

In issuing the proclamation, Mayor Bennett commended the local veterans in the carrying on of their meritorious work. Following is the proclamation: "Whereas the American Legion Post of Hood River has secured for exhibition purposes, in this city, the war department's official motion picture made by the signal corps, and

whereas, the said pictures show America's part in the world war, and also show the part played by all the allied countries, depicting the great battles, Oosterau Thelery, St. Mihiel, and the Argonne, showing the boys from Oregon in action and in whose record all cities of this state take the greatest pride, and

whereas, said pictures have been officially designated "On Flanders Field," and the funds received from the exhibition at the Elks Theatre in this city June 24 are to be used by the American Legion in carrying on their charitable work and in purchasing a set of colors.

Therefore, I, A. B. Bennett, Mayor of Hood River, in order to draw special attention to these historical, educational and patriotic official films, and the worthy purposes for which they are shown, do earnestly request the citizens of Hood River to renounce the patriotic purposes of this exhibition, and urge the merchants and business houses to set up their flags on the street, and thus aid in making "On Flanders Field Day" one on which we will recall the glorious memory paid in France and Flanders field by our boys for flag and country.
