Five Grove School District No. 7
WHEREAS, heretofore by law, a reso-
lution of the District School Board of
said School District No. 7, Hood River
County, Oregon, was duly passed sub-
mitting to the legal voters of said Dis-
trict the question of contracting a
negotiable interest bearing warrant in-
debtedness of said School District in
the sum of Nineteen thousand dollars
(\$19,000) for the purpose of providing
funds with which to build a school
building in and for said district, and
that a school meeting be called for that
purpose, and said School Board there-
upon directed the Clerk of said District
to cause to be posted a notice of school
meeting in the form and manner pre-
scribed by law, which said notice of
meeting was duly posted by the Clerk
of said district; and
WHEREAS, the said meeting was
duly and legally held in said School
District No. 7, Hood River County,
Oregon, on the 25th day of August,
1926, and
WHEREAS, a majority of the votes
cast at the said election read "NEGO-
TIABLE INTEREST BEARING WAR-
RANTS—YES"; and
WHEREAS, the District School
Board of School District No. 7, Hood
River County, Oregon, has examined
and investigated the regularity of the
proceedings for the said school meeting
and finds that the same was duly and
legally called and held; that the notice
thereof required by law to be given has
been duly and regularly given in the
form, for the time and in the manner
required by law, and that the said
meeting was conducted in strict con-
formity with the requirements of law,
and that the votes at said meeting have
been duly ascertained and the results
thereof canvassed and returns thereof
made, filed, recorded and reported as
required by law, and that the said
proposition to contract a negotiable in-
terest bearing warrant indebtedness of
said School District in the sum of
Nineteen thousand dollars (\$19,000)
for the purpose of providing funds as

assent of more than a majority of the

FRED HERTZ, PIONEER,
DIED LAST WEEK
Fred Hertz, 81, native of Michigan
and Civil War veteran, died at the
Hood River hospital Wednesday night
of last week. Mr. Hertz came to the
district 35 years ago, taking up a tim-
ber claim in the Oak Grove section.
For many years he was a millwright
for the Davenport Lumber Co. The old
man has lived alone for a number of
years in Oak Grove. In earlier days
he donated a large block of property in
Hood River as a site for the Catholic
church. Little is known of relatives of
Mr. Hertz.
Funeral services for Mr. Hertz were
held Saturday at the Anderson chapel,
Rev. Father Hugh J. Marshall, pastor
of St. Mary's Catholic church, officiat-
ing. Interment followed at the Catho-
lic cemetery.

THIRD STREET IS
CLOSED TO PARKING
Municipal authorities have closed
Third street, main thoroughfare lead-
ing down across the business district
to fruit receiving warehouses, to all
automobile parking until the valley's
apple crop has been delivered. During
the height of apple harvest apple
trucks and wagons line the cross street
for several blocks, and parking regula-
tions are enforced to prevent congest-
ion.
The parking regulations will be
strictly enforced. City Traffic Officer
Morrison will tag all cars parked on
Third through apple traffic street.
Shopping stops will be permitted.

Fewer Grades Wanted
Definite plans for reducing the
grades of boxed apples in north central
Washington, orchard districts from
three to five eliminating the present C-
grade and for disposing of the inferior
apples, were made at a second confer-
ence of growers at Wenatchee last
week.
An executive committee of 13 mem-
bers to outline methods of revising
grading rules, was named, as was an-
other of five members to devise means
of disposing of the inferior apples.
About 40 representative growers, of
whom 25 were official delegates from
Wenatchee growers' meetings, were
present.

Kins is Exonerated by Jury
Funeral services for Y. Abe, pioneer
Upper Valley Japanese orchardist,
were held at the Anderson chapel last
Friday, interment following at Idle-
wild cemetery. Mr. Abe was killed
instantly Wednesday of last week when
struck by an automobile driven by Jack
Kins, employe of M. P. Gibbon. The
good Japanese was crossing the street
at Parkdale when struck by the truck.
He was carrying a gift box of pears to
Mrs. Alice Williams, when the fatal
accident occurred.
A coroner's jury last Thursday ex-
onerated Mrs. Kins of any blame for
the accident.
