**GLOBE ENCIRCLING
MOTOR CAR HERE**

An automobile, covered with photo-
graphs taken in communities of every
continent and driven by Merlin Haynes,
established soldier, has created consider-
able attention here the past few days.
Mr. Haynes, who is accompanied by
his wife, on arrival here, had com-
pleted 782,000 miles of travel since
1919, when he was discharged from
the army. Mr. Haynes was overseas
with the 31st Division. He was gassed
twice in the Argonne campaign and
had a portion of his hip bone shot
away by shrapnel.

Mr. and Mrs. Haynes will remain
here another week and then will head
for the Atlantic coast in their much
traveled automobile.

"To date," said Mr. Haynes, "we
have covered 677,447 miles by auto, 514,
408 miles by train, 66,412 miles
on water, and 503 miles on foot. Dur-
ing our seven years of travel we have
been through the United States, Can-
ada, Alaska, Mexico, Central and South
America, British Honduras, Panama,
Costa Rica, Nicaragua, Hawaiian
Islands, Philippine Islands, China,
Japan, Cuba, Africa, Germany, France,
Sardinia, England, Denmark, Norway
and Portugal.

"During the next few years we ex-
pect to tour the remainder of Europe,
Asia and Africa and our tour in
Australia in 1930 or 1931, when we
have 1,000,000 miles to our credit. We
are confident this will set a record for
continuous traveling.

"We have had many people tell us
that this amount of traveling would be
impossible except for those of unlimited
means. We started with \$3.00 cash,
intending to work our way from place
to place, and a sign painter. We have
had many strange experiences and
some real hardships. We burned out
a bearing and tore out the rear
end of our first car on the Great So-
noran desert in Mexico. The tempera-
ture was 125 in the shade, and the
only shade we had was from our car.
We went without food and water for
three days, walking 65 miles to the
nearest town in the Sonora section.

"We have been caught in several
snowstorms in the mountains, one of
the worst of these being 110 miles from
Nome, Alaska. We lived on the raw
meat of a seal and frozen fish for 21
days. We had to chop fish out of the
ice for our dogs, for we were traveling
by dog train then.

Mr. Haynes says that he has engaged
every line worker from washing
dishes to paying bills in a bank, since
he and Mrs. Haynes started their trip.

"You may wonder what is the object
of our tour," said the wanderer. "It is
twofold. First, I want to accomplish
an ambition of years to write books of
travel. And, secondly, the wandering
satisfies a spirit of wanderlust, which
I suppose all of us have to a certain
extent. I guess we have a little more
of it than the ordinary person."

While here Mr. and Mrs. Haynes
have been picking apples on the or-
chard place of F. H. Abston, whose
home is off the Columbia River high-
way just east of Mitchell's Point.

Macrum Get Fine Roosters
Mr. and Mrs. C. A. Macrum, of the
Dee district, who have one of the most
successful poultry farms of the valley,
were here last week to receive also
recent orders, shipped to them
from the Grille Poultry farm, of
Canby. The birds were declared by
those who saw them to be as pretty as
any ever seen here. They are of the
Wattle Leghorn breed.

Mr. and Mrs. Macrum and their son,
Charles, who began the poultry busi-
ness in a small way several years ago,
have constantly expanded. Poultry ex-
hibitions who have visited their place re-
cently say their flocks are among the
best in the state.

S. P. & S. Co. to Lease Sites
At a meeting of the Skamania Coun-
ty, Washington, Historical society, D. A.
Brown announced that the Seattle,
Portland and Spokane R. R. Co. had
prepared a lease of the property on
which will be restored blockhouses and
fortifications used in defense against
Indians in pioneer days. Completion
of a new bridge across the Columbia
river just below the Cascades, on the
site of the legendary Bridge of the
Gods, has stimulated an interest among
members of the historical association.

Fruit Growers Play Chemistry Game
Fruit growers of the Hood River valley
last week and demanded the
United States bureau of chemistry for
alleged neglect in failure to carry out
the modification orders of Secretary
Ferdinand last summer against the spray
situation. It was charged also that the
chemistry department was incompetent
and inexperienced.

The report of the "emergency com-
mittee" was read by H. Van Hornes-
burg, of Gold Hill, who declared that
the drastic order relative to spray
residue was the result of pressure from
England.
Another meeting has been called
when the local delegates to the confer-
ence of coast fruit growing sections to
be held at Portland Friday were given
instructions as to the policy to follow.
