**SUZANNE LENGLEN  
COMING TO PORTLAND**

Suzanne Lenglen, famous French tennis star and woman tennis champion of the world, accompanied by a group of American and French tennis stars, who are making a tour of the United States, under the direction of C. C. Pyle, will appear in a series of tennis matches Saturday night, December 4, at the Portland Coliseum, 21st and Marshall streets. Tennis players and tennis fans from all parts of Oregon and Washington will be on hand to see this great aggregation of tennis stars and the announcement of their Portland appearance is being received with enthusiasm and from all indications of advance seat sales a capacity audience will be on hand to see Suzanne, the incomparable.

Accompanying Suzanne will be Mary K. Brown, twice champion woman tennis player of the United States, who has an enviable record of being the only person who has been a finalist in both tennis and golf; Vincent Richards, for three years a member of the Davis Cup team; Paul Feret of France, one of the first four of his country; Howard Kinsley, a leader among American tennis players, and Harvey Snodgrass, prominent player from California.

Play will be held in women's and men's singles, men's doubles and mixed doubles. They carry their own courts, made especially for the tour and the only one of its kind in existence. This will be erected at the Coliseum along with the court enclosures, and the affair will have all the earmarks of a real championship event.

Mary K. Brown receives a bonus of \$100 for every three games she can win from Suzanne, with \$25 for every additional game, while Feret is given \$25 for every three games and \$25 for every additional game he can win from Vincent Richards. This has been done by the promoters to keep up the interest of the players, and those who have seen them in action say there is not a dull moment from the time Suzanne comes on the court until the last ball has been served.

Officials will be chosen from the prominent tennis players of Portland and the state.

A number of local tennis enthusiasts will attend the games in Portland.

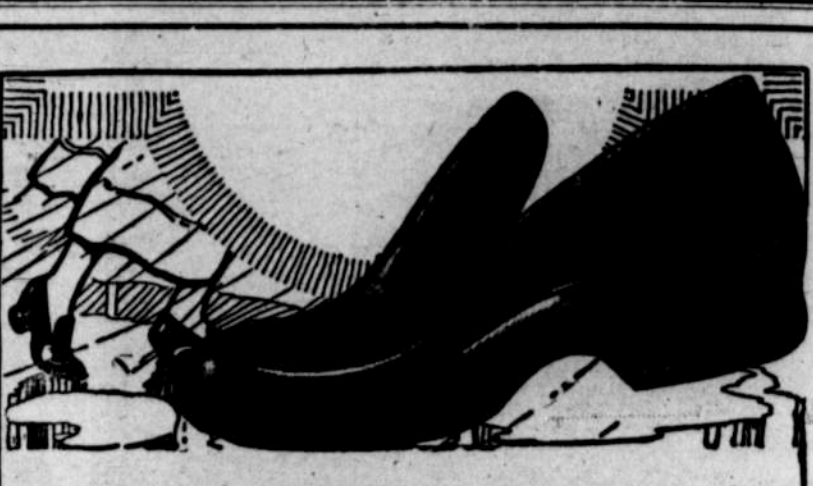
