HITCHING RACKS MISSED BY MANY

Hood River is moving too fast for a few of the orchardists who continue to drive horse-drawn vehicles to transport their apples to shipping warehouses. They have appealed to city authorities to provide hitching racks. The remnant of mid-Columbia Indians, residents of farms between here and Mosier, too, say they find the loss of hitching racks very annoying, and the aborigines have joined in the petition. They say that their cousins of the Warm Springs and Yakima reservations, accustomed to come here to participate in strawberry harvest, will pass up the town if they can find no place to hitch their teams and improve ponies.

The recent hard-surfacing of a portion of State street eliminated the last hitching racks in the city.
