**Apple Crop 57.3 Per Cent**  
The condition of the country's apple crop on June 1, according to the United States Department of Agriculture announcement made June 9, is 57.3 per cent of normal. No estimate of production was given. The condition of the crop by states is given in per cents as follows:

Maine 90, New Hampshire 86, Vermont 88, Massachusetts 78, Rhode Island 75, Connecticut 72, New York 72, New Jersey 68, Pennsylvania 63, Ohio 56, Indiana 49, Illinois 51, Michigan 76, Wisconsin 82, Minnesota 85, Iowa 78, Missouri 44, South Dakota 57, Nebraska 77, Kansas 68, Delaware 55, Maryland 54, Virginia 29, West Virginia 29, North Carolina 30, South Carolina 44, Georgia 32, Kentucky 26, Tennessee 33, Alabama 34, Mississippi 45, Arkansas 29, Louisiana 38, Oklahoma 46, Texas 35, Montana 99, Idaho 81, Wyoming 75, Colorado 72, Arizona 38, Arizona 55, Utah 83, Nevada 55, Washington 64, Oregon 67, and California 58.

Last year the commercial production of apples was 30,065,000 bushels.

Mr. Carline left New York City Wednesday of last week for the Northwest. He made several stops on his way out, visiting various shipping points in the Northwest, as well as in California, and expects to be gone a month.
