The move on the part of dam workers to get under one roof with their families rather than pay rent in Portland and board in the camps at Bonneville, is bringing new families to town each week. Accurate figures are lacking, but indications are that 25 new families came to the Locks last week. These, of course, include those stopping in cabins along the highway and in camp grounds. Merchants generally reported good business over the weekend.

Dr. E. H. Berger, Portland physician, who now spends three days a week in Cascade Locks, is reported to be building up quite a nice practice. The wish is repeatedly expressed on the street that he may be able to develop sufficient practice to keep him in Cascade Locks all of the time.

Friday, the 13th, was no laughing matter with S. M. Hill, for someone borrowed his automobile trailer long enough to steal the tires off of it. You know, as they say in the funny papers, the thief is known and if he doesn't patch the tires and return them he will be reported to the law.

J. B. Laber, owner of a very considerable portion of the townsite in Cascade Locks, has caused a plat to be made of his properties and is preparing to open streets through it. Surveyors employed by Mr. Laber have finished their work and a crew of men will be put to work cleaning out the underbrush. According to present plans, the streets will follow contours of the hills. They are to be 40 feet in width. By making the thoroughfares conform to the hills much unnecessary filling and grading will be avoided as the residential district develops, and the shape of the streets will permit purchasers of lots to landscape their properties at a minimum cost.
