Cancelled by Government**

All deals looking to the sale of the 32 bunkhouses formerly owned by the General Construction company and located at the top of the hill above Eagle creek are off, it was announced Thursday at the United States engineers' office.

The bunkhouses, built by the construction company when it set about the task of putting in the upper cofferdam at Bradford island, have become the property of the federal government. The war department will retain title and reserve the bunkhouses for the use of contractors who are to be engaged in relocating the Union Pacific tracks. When that work starts the buildings will be used as will be used as living quarters by workmen.
