**Move to Incorporate
Town is Defeated**
Property owners and residents of Cascade Locks are not ready yet to incorporate the town into a municipality. This was demonstrated last Tuesday night when a large crowd gathered at the Odd Fellows hall to discuss the subject.
Postmaster Frank Hall presided at the meeting. After stating the purpose for which the meeting had been called, he invited proponents and opponents to discuss the issue. When no one arose to talk he asked all those present who wanted to incorporate to stand. The crowd did not stir. He then called for a vote, asking that all who were opposed to incorporating the town to say "aye." The chorus of ayes swept the hall. The affirmative vote was meager and scattering.
Upon motion of A. W. Meyer the vote was made formal and official, and the meeting was declared adjourned.
Suddenness of the action caught the crowd by surprise and the people began pouring down the stairway while others were still arriving for the meeting. However, everybody went away in a good humor.

**Penn Tavern Builds
Modern Apartments**
W. G. Penn and Miss K. C. Geer, of Penn's Tavern, has just finished up four new bungalow apartments, which are the equal of the interior of apartments found in Portland and other coast cities.
The Penn Tavern, started three years ago, has grown steadily in size until now there are accommodations for a total of 16 families. Demand for living quarters has enabled the management to keep the apartments filled. However, four are reserved for transients.
The four new bungalows stand just east of the tavern proper. They were built at a cost of \$10,000, have tub and shower baths, hot and cold water, built-in sinks and other modern conveniences. Engineers and other well paid employes of the government at Bonneville dam have snapped up the apartments until there is no problem in keeping them rented.
Fame of the tavern has spread up and down the coast and tourists are stopping at it in increasing numbers. Of late it has been necessary to turn away patrons. The interior of the tavern has been remodeled to permit of the building of a private dining room, just back of the main restaurant.

THE HOMEMAKER
Baked Ham and Pineapple.—Ham baked with brown sugar and pineapple will make the men in your family glad they hurried home early for dinner. Place slice of ham 1 1/2 or 2 inches in thickness in baking pan. Cover with 1/2 cup of brown sugar. Take juice of small can of diced pineapple and add sufficient water to make cup of liquid. Pour the liquid into pan and baste occasionally after ham begins to cook. Bake in moderate oven for an hour. When about half done, sprinkle the ham with pineapple fruit. Sweet potatoes are delicious when baked with the ham.

Quick mixing is the secret of good muffins. The muffins should be put together in half a minute. Muffin batter loses gas very quickly, and if you are slow in mixing the gas evaporates and the muffins are soggy when they come from the oven.
If meat you are cooking is inclined to be tough, try adding a little vinegar. The vinegar helps to make the meat tender. Or the meat may be dipped in vinegar before cooking. French dressing, made either of lemon juice or vinegar and poured over it insures tenderness. The roast should be allowed to stand over night after the dressing has been poured over it. Roasting hens and turkeys are also improved by this treatment.

Dried Beef and Waffles. Creamed dried beef, served with waffles, makes a splendid Sunday morning breakfast. Pull the dried beef into small pieces, turn into frying pan, add bacon drippings and cook until it is crisp and brown. Add flour, blend thoroughly with bacon fat and beef and brown slightly. Add milk and cook until gravy thickens, stirring constantly. Browning the meat and flour gives a rich flavor and appetizing color to an otherwise colorless dish.

Apple Sauce. You have your own way of preparing apple sauce, of course. Here is another method. It was given to us by a man who enjoys putting around the kitchen. Core and quarter the apples as usual, but instead of peeling, cook with skins on. When done, put through a course collander and add sugar. This gives a delightful flavor to a favorite dish.

Onion Odors. Young green onions may be put in the ice box without injury to other foods if wrapped in an oiled paper. The paper forces the onions to keep their flavor at home. It is a wise precaution to sprinkle a little water on the onions before wrapping them. This will keep them crisp and fresh.

Charcoal in Ice Box. If you experience trouble in keeping your ice box or refrigerator sweet, try a piece of charcoal. The charcoal is highly absorbent and will take up the odors. Placed next to melons, bananas and other highly flavored foods, it will prevent butter, milk and eggs from becoming tainted.

An Ice Drink. A delightful iced drink for warm afternoons can be made from a single orange. Pour the juice of an orange into an ordinary glass or tumbler, add ice and sugar and fill with water. The secret lies in getting plenty of sugar. Two rounding spoonfuls are enough.
