**Seepage Not Embarrassing.**

Indians and old timers were wrong when they insisted that the seepage through the gravel of Bradford island would embarrass the army engineers, who are pumping out the lake between the cofferdams in the slough at Bonneville dam.

The sump, containing 70 feet of water when the big pumps were started, has been almost half emptied and can be drained in its entirety anytime the contractor is ready to give the word.

Water is seeping back into the lake at the rate of 40,000 gallons a minute, but the pumps are lifting it out at the rate of 60,000 gallons a minute. The engineers are waiting for the river to fall before finishing the job. The lake probably will not be drained until about July 1, when the water in the Columbia will be sufficiently low to permit work to start on the foundation of the power house.

**Cottages Being Built.**

Quite a colony of cottages has been built at the top of the hill, just below Bonneville, and another group of seven cottages will be constructed at once for occupancy by owners.

No name has been selected for the district but here are indications that it is going to become known as West Bonneville. The Enquist addition contains about 20 cottages, and on below beyond it two or three blocks is another group of a dozen cottages. The newest settlement is two blocks east of the Bonny Villa.

The property owned by the U. P. railroad has been leased by engineers, who are building their own cottages. A majority of the cottages contain three or four rooms. The property is being handled by Nick Pearson, engineer in charge of railroad relocation work at Bonneville.

A total of 13 cottages has been built, bringing the number of families in the district up to nearly 60, with more going up.

Dedication services at the Bonneville community church last Sunday were largely attended. The Community Center was packed and people who came late were forced to stand outdoors.

**Cold Storage Plant Opens.**

With the opening of the new cold storage plant recently completed by W. H. Clark on property near the Catholic church, business houses above and below the toll bridge, from Wyeth to Multnomah Falls, can enjoy prompt service on ice cream, beer, vegetables, fruit and other commodities which they have heretofore had to buy in Portland in large quantities.

The new plant has a capacity of approximately 5000 cubic feet. The cold storage room can be held at a steady temperature of 40 degrees and the zero room can be kept below freezing point at all times.

Biggest demand for space to date has come from breweries. Beer is being placed in cold storage by the truck load. The plant permits retailers to carry reasonably large stocks on hand and makes it unnecessary for them to depend upon daily service out of Portland.

Mr. Clark is putting a truck on the highway. It will deliver throughout the district and on the Washington side if occasion demands it.

**Opens Shower Baths.**

Mrs. Sam Hill has opened her shower baths next door to the Dam Inn, and from this time forward there can be no excuse for any man foregoing his Saturday night bath. The showers are equipped with a dressing room and there is an abundance of hot water. They will be open from 7 a. m. until 11 at night, and men coming off shift can make arrangements to obtain baths at any hour of the night.
