The Dam Chronicle**Wirrick to Open Saturday.**

John Wirrick is opening his new Red & White store on Main street to the public this week. He is joining with J. H. Carlson, owner of the Red & White store on the highway, just east of the city limits, in putting on a sale which is expected to draw a large crowd of shoppers.

The two stores will serve refreshments all day. They are giving away a large number of prizes and will have demonstrations.

The Wirrick store occupies the new tile and stone building, across the street from Merrill's Barbecue. It makes the fourth grocery in town and will carry a substantial stock.

New business houses continue to open in Cascade Locks. Latest is fresh fruit and vegetable stand, which will serve the Bonneville Dam area. It is owned by Harry Beam and Jesse Ott, of The Dalles, and is under management of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Brower. Mr. Beam owns and operates the Nob Hill fruit ranch and Mr. Ott has a vegetable farm. The fruit and produce being offered for sale in the district is being hauled down from The Dalles.

Parras Plans Big Opening.

Silver E. Parras, for seven years in his old location opposite the Dam Inn, will open his new market, up by the postoffice, to the public Saturday.

The opening promises to take on something of a gala affair, for both Mr. and Mrs. Parras have many friends and are popular throughout the Bonneville-Dam area.

Mr. Parras has obtained flowers, which he will distribute to the ladies with his compliments, and there will be music, free lemonade and cookies. Workmen have been busy all week getting the new meat market ready for the Saturday opening. They have finished and the cases have been installed.

Wednesday's noonday luncheon of the Chamber of Commerce was one of the best attended to date since the chamber was organized two months ago. The luncheon was held at Penn's Tavern, on the highway, just east of town. It was attended by 45 people. The impression prevails that the meetings are the best held by any town up to 10,000 people in Oregon and word of the activity in the chamber is spreading over the state.

Next week's luncheon will be held at the Bridge of the Gods hotel. The hotel has sufficient space to accommodate all guests in the dining room.

Details of plans for the Fourth occupied much of the time at the luncheon. President A. W. Meyer told the chamber members that he would not be satisfied with a purse of less than \$1005 after the Fourth-of-July celebration.

Practically half of the automobiles traveling through Cascade Locks are from out of state, it was learned Friday from a traffic survey conducted by C. E. Carns, incharge of maintenance in this district. The survey, made over a period of 16 hours, gave the following count:
