Cascade Locks Public Schools Well Staffed

Since the first notice of the school census being taken in Cascade Locks was printed, several people have called on the superintendent regarding the opening of school and who can attend.

The Cascade Locks schools are in Hood River county and can take grade school children only east of the county line, and west of the Shell Rock farm at Wyeth. Any child living across the line in Multnomah county should attend the school at Bonneville, except high school students as will be later explained.

The Cascade Locks grade school is a graded school, with two grades to a teacher. Each teacher is selected by the county board, after fully considering every need of the community, and only instructors of the first rank are employed. Proximity to Portland, good living conditions, and cashable pay checks bring a multitude of good applicants for every job.

In selecting the teachers, classroom work is given first consideration, although each one must be a specialist in some line of activity. In the grade school one teacher specializes in music, another in art, another in physical training, etc. The activities are handled along lines of a platoon system.

The high school is a four-year standard high school, with credits accepted in any university, college or high school. Due to the size of the school it is necessary to follow the dictation of the state department of education, and subjects are taught in hour long periods, and alteration of subjects each year. Besides high school subjects, plays, operettas, and athletics are taught and presented each year.

Besides taking students from the grade school district, anyone from the east end of Multnomah county may enter the school here. For the past two years students coming from Warrendale have taken the east bound Union Pacific which brings the passenger direct to the high school at 9:30 each morning, and leave on either the 3 or 5 o'clock bus for the return. Money for transportation is given each month by the Hood River county board, and collected from Multnomah county, along with the tuition, at the end of the school year.

Texts are furnished free of charge in the grade school, but each student takes care of his own books in high school. At present five students living in Multnomah county have signified their intention of entering Cascade Locks high school this fall.

Painters engaged in shining up the toll bridge are making rapid progress on the job, but will be another month in getting on the last touch of the final coat. The bridge is being covered with aluminum paint, which gives the effect of silver in the bright sunshine. When the work is completed the bridge may be seen for long distances up and down the river.

The Dalles Freight Line has completed its new warehouse on Main street and is now occupying the building. Provisions were made in the building for an apartment, which will be occupied by the local agent, R. J. Wuner, and Mrs. Wuner. The company has given up its quarters in Mrs. Hill's building and is now handling all freight out of the new quarters.
