STAFF IN GRADE HIGH SCHOOL IS COMPLETED

Although Odell and Parkdale high schools will not open for the year until September 17, the Cascade Locks high school will follow the other schools and open on Tuesday morning, September 4.

To complete the local faculty, the county board Monday announced the selection of Miss Margaret Lacy of Portland as the new teacher for the grade school. Miss Lacy is a graduate of the Oregon state normal and for the past year has been teaching in the Catlin school in Portland. She will work in the primary department and handle the physical educational work for the grade girls.

The faculty now includes: V. G. Henderson, superintendent, sociology and commerce, and directs boys' athletics and dramatics; Miss Katherine Walker, English and mathematics and high school music and girls' athletics; F. B. Autrieth, seventh and eighth grades and boys' athletics; Miss Wilma Eddy, fifth and sixth and grade music; Miss Margaret Lacy, third and fourth and girls' physical education; Miss Averill Stewart, first and second grades and primary music.

For pupils living east of Carlson's store to the Wyeth postoffice the bus will leave the eastern terminus about 8:15, arriving at the school grounds 30 minutes later. George Thomas will again be in charge of the bus.

Pupils living west of Carlson's and within bounds of the county will need to walk to school. High school pupils living in this end of Multnomah county may make arrangements to ride on the Union Pacific stages which arrives at the school about 9:40. Transportation for these students will be advanced by the Hood River county school board. Tuition for the out of county students will be taken care of by the Multnomah county superintendent. Therefore, the only cost to the student is the usual outlay for text books.

Grade school texts will be furnished but it is necessary for the pupil to supply pencils, pens and paper.

The school buildings have been worked on all summer to get them in good repair for the winter. Janitor Charles Haggblom has been busy with hammer and saw in both buildings and the improvements are many. Jack Eimer, local electrician, has been working the past few days going over some of the wiring and installing a flood light on top of the high school building.
