GOVERNMENT TO MAKE STUDY OF POWER MARKET

Col. Thomas M. Robins, United States division engineer, with headquarters in Portland, will direct a comprehensive study to be made in the next 90 days for the purpose of developing a market for hydro electric power in the Pacific northwest.

The survey will include present and potential market for power now being developed in private plants and in the plants which are being built at Bonneville dam and Coulee dam.

Colonel Robins will lay his report before the Pacific northwest conference, to be held in Seattle in December. The studies to be made under his direction will include:

Inventory of available data and sources of information (as to production, present and potential, costs, rates; transmission; distribution, markets, present and potential), and of additional data required; assembly and analysis of data; conclusions and recommendations concerning research, policies, and plans for the production, transmission, distribution, marketing and use of power.
