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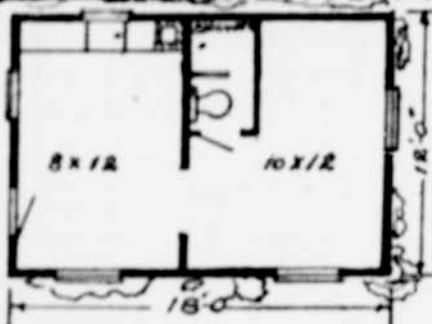

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War Just Pastime With Fighting Men of Epirus

Epirus is the land "where men die young." This territory in south-eastern Europe formerly belonged to Turkey, but now is divided between Greece and Albania. In 1912, Albania, including Epirus, broke away from Turkey and became independent. Two years later young Greek patriots went to Epirus to investigate a revolt against the rest of Albania, intending to bring about the annexation of Epirus to Greece. The revolution was successful and for two years Epirus was a free country. In 1916 Italy intervened and after a period of military occupation declared that Epirus should be returned to Albania.

In 1914 the revolutionists issued postage stamps illustrating the flag of Epirus with an inscription meaning "self-governing Epirus." This is but a living record of the country's short-lived independence.

In Epirus, a bare mountainous country, the women do all the work as the men conserve all their energy for fighting, which is a national pastime of all Albanians. There are many curious customs connected with the feudal warfare of this fighting people. One is that no man shall be killed if he is accompanied by a woman.—Washington Post.

Napoleon Founder of One of Greatest Industries

Napoleon's fame extends beyond that of a notable military genius; he was the founder of one of the greatest of modern industries—canning, writes Fred James, in the Montreal Herald. He is credited with being directly responsible for the discovery that food could be kept, if sealed, in air-tight containers. The feeding of his armies was one of first concern with him. He knew that well-fed troops are vitally important to success. There's little, if any, courage or zeal in men with empty stomachs.

In 1800 Francois Appert, another Frenchman, evidently inspired by Napoleon's discovery, found that food put in airtight containers required to be sterilized.

While Frenchmen have the distinction of discovering the art of canning, it was an Englishman who invented the tin can. The most notable development of the canning industry has, however, taken place in North America.

Presidential Succession

It was at the instance of Vice President Hendricks' death in November, 1885, that the Presidential succession act was created in 1886. The act provided an order of succession of the cabinet officers in the event of the removal, death, resignation or disability of President and Vice President. John Sherman was president of the senate pro tem at this time. It is not likely that he would have taken the President's place. Perhaps congress would have taken some action, or one of the political parties. This situation has never arisen and there is no specific provision in the Constitution or in law to cover the point.—Cleveland Plain Dealer.

Canning Industry in U. S.

The canning industry in the United States was established by Ezra Duggett in 1819. He had learned the trade before emigrating to this country, and packed salmon, lobsters and oysters in New York. The records show that William Underwood packed preserves and table condiments in glass as early as 1821 in Boston. Records also show that he shipped his goods to South America in 1821. In 1837 Isaac Winslow began experimenting with the canning of corn in Portland, Me. There is probably no earlier record of canning in tin in this country than the work of Isaac Winslow. Maine was the home of corn canning.

St. John's Bread

The "husks" eaten by the prodigal son in the Bible parable are identified in a Mediterranean legume with a sweet edible pulp which is called St. John's bread, says Llewellyn Williams, botanist of the Field museum.

WOMEN ARE HURT WHEN CARS MEET NEAR LOCKS

A new Pontiac coach driven by J. D. Barnes, Portland, was wrecked when it collided head on with a Chrysler just beyond the fox farm at the east end of Cascade Locks Tuesday night. Barnes was cut over the eye and Miss Martie O'Dea, who was riding with him, was treated for minor injuries by Dr. Stanley E. Wells, Bonneville.

The driver of the Chrysler escaped in the dark, leaving his car on the highway. Witnesses to the accident said three people were riding in the Chrysler, which was being towed behind a truck. A woman was reported to have been thrown into the windshield.

Witnesses declared the Chrysler was running almost abreast the truck while under tow, and that Barnes had no opportunity to escape being hit. After the accident he passengers in the unidentified car are said to have climbed into the truck and fled. The Chrysler is registered in the name of Amanda Wuest, Portland, and the truck in the name of George Wuest, Hood River. State police began a search for them in Hood River.

WESTERN DAIRY BUILDS MILK ROUTE IN DISTRICT

The Western Dairy Products company, makers of Sunfreeze ice cream, and owners of the Hollywood dairy in Seattle and Hood River, are building up a milk route in the Bonneville Dam area. The company has its own herds of cows in the Hood River valley.

Allen T. Clark, Portland, brother of Ralph Nelson of the Lake-side market, is in charge of the district on both sides of the river for the company in this territory. The company handles only pasteurized milk.

MOST BEAUTIFUL TREE

Handsome Christmas tree erected in the Bonneville Dam district during the holidays was put up by Walter Kanzler, master electrician for the Columbia Construction company, in front of his home on Bradford Island. The tree revolved on a pedestal and was illuminated by changing flood lights of 16 different combinations. It was erected at considerable expense. Machinery employed in gaining the lighting effects came from San Francisco. The tree was blown over by the wind shortly after it was put up, but was set up again the next day.
