GRANDMA WAHL TAKEN BY DEATH FOLLOWING ATTACK OF INFLUENZA

Mrs. Margaret Wahl, known for years to Cascade Locks residents as Grandma Wahl, died Tuesday morning at the home of her son-in-law, J. H. Fulgham, next door to Carlson's Red & White store, at the age of 87 years.

Despite her advanced age, Mrs. Wahl had enjoyed fair health until she contracted influenza.

Born in Alabama, Mrs. Wahl came to Oregon in 1916 with her son-in-law and daughter and continued to make her home in Cascade Locks up to the time of her death. Her daughter died at the family home last summer.

Mrs. Wahl is survived by four grandchildren: Mrs. Bruce Wheeler of Cascade Locks, Earl Fulgham of Dallas, Oregon, Marcus Fulgham of Palmer, Oregon, and Henry Fulgham of Cascade Locks.

Funeral services will be held Thursday. Burial will be in Hood River.

Fishy Facts

Nine hundred thousand tons of coal are used to catch the 200,000 tons of fish landed at Grimsby every year, where the largest ice factory in the world turns out 1,200 tons of ice a day. Brought from the furthest parts of the North sea, the landings begin at 5 a. m. every weekday morning on the "pontoon," which is the name for the concrete market. The fish is auctioned from north to south, cleaned and frequently filleted, boxed in ice and packed in the vans of express night trains to catch the early morning markets at Billingsgate in London and elsewhere.—The News Magazine.

The Saar Basin

The Saar basin lies north of Lorraine, and contains about 708 square miles and 770,000 population (1926). Extensive coal fields occupy the middle of the valley between Saarlands to the northwest and the Saar river on the west. These mines, which came into German possession with the territory after the Franco-German war, produce annually more than 7,000,000 tons of high grade coal and employ 50,000 men.
