The captain also reviewed the Engineer's activities in safety work, the helpful contests now under way, and suggestions offered by men for improved protections for the men.

Following an urgent message by Major H. A. Skerry for immediate action on any corrective measure, Captain J. S. Gorlinski, Dr. Stanley E. Wells, Howard MacC. Rigler, Fred McGee and Frank C. Linton participated in a lively discussion of the situation.
