Locks Awaits Courts' Setting Election Dates

Following Tuesday's election, when Cascade Locks voted 129 to 101 to incorporate, public interest turned to the special electin of city officials, who will serve until January.

A mayor, recorder, marshall, treasurer and council of six aldermen are the elective officers to be chosen by registerd voters within the city limits at an election, date of which will be set by the Hood River county court. Within 10 days after Tuesday's election the court must proclaim the town incorporated. Not less than 10 days
