Phone Company Pays Its Taxes

PHONE COMPANY
The Pacific Telephone & Telegraph company has turned over to the tax collector \$2,578.15 in payment of its real and personal property tax in Hood River county. The tax in the county, before discount for prompt payment, was \$2,857.89.

Total real and personal property taxes of the company now being paid throughout the state amount to \$750,950, according to manager H. L. Davenport.

When other taxes—federal, franchise and miscellaneous—are included, the 1934 tax bill for the company in Oregon totals \$966,571, or \$8.67 per telephone based on the average number of telephones in service in 1934. This tax per telephone is \$1.30 higher for Oregon than the tax per telephone of \$7.37 for the company as a whole.

SPRING SPORTS PLANS FORMULATED BY MEN

Recreational activities were foremost in the minds of the many men quartered in the bunkhouses last week. Tentative plans were laid for the building of a baseball and softball diamond on the area now covered by the rock pile, provided the supply can be removed before too late in the spring.

HIGHWAY GRADE TO BE RAISED SEVERAL FEET

Despite reports to the contrary, the highway through Cascade Locks will be raised to a new level when the state completes the new grade, preparatory to laying a hard surface. Work preliminary to letting the contract for the grading continues, with the telephone company and the power making ready to move their poles.

In the absence of an official statement it is not known to what height the grade will be lifted, but there is every indication that the Dew Drop Inn and other buildings in the district opposite the Cascade Food Store will be well below grade.
